

NOBEL PEACE PROJECTS TO HELP 23,000 CHILDREN AFFECTED BY CONFLICTS

On 10 December, the EU was awarded the 2012 Nobel Peace Prize for its over six decades' contribution to the advancement of peace and reconciliation, democracy and human rights in Europe.

The European Union's Nobel Peace prize money as well as a contribution from the European Commission totalling to €2 million will fund four projects under the EU Children of Peace initiative. The projects aim to provide basic education and child-friendly spaces for Syrian, Colombian, Congolese and Pakistani children who have been displaced, living in refugee camps or affected by conflict. ➤ More

EU BOOSTS FUNDING FOR SYRIA TO KEEP UP WITH INCREASING HUMANITARIAN NEEDS

The European Commission will provide additional humanitarian funding of €30 million to help people affected by the Syrian crisis, bringing its total contribution to over €126 million. The new aid will target approximately 2 million people in Syria, and a considerable number of the more than 474,000 Syrians who have fled across the borders. \triangleright More

EU AND SINGAPORE CONCLUDE NEGOTIATIONS FOR FREE TRADE AGREEMENT (16 DECEMBER)

The EU-Singapore FTA will be the EU's second ambitious agreement with a key Asian trading partner, after the EU-Korea FTA, which has been in operation since July 2011. The agreement is also the EU's first "green" FTA especially designed to promote green growth, in line with the EU's "2020 strategy" for a competitive economy. More

EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT APPROVES HISTORIC EUROPEAN UNITARY PATENT PACKAGE

Efforts to create a common patent applicable across all European countries have been made since the 1960s but for a number of reasons have never been successful. The unitary patent will allow patent protection to be obtained for 25 Member States on the basis of a single application and without further administrative formalities, like validation and translation requirements, in the Member States. > More

COMMISSION PROPOSES IMPROVED RULES TO ENFORCE EU RIGHTS UNDER INTERNATIONAL TRADE AGREEMENTS

"The EU's membership in the World Trade Organisation and bilateral trade agreements help the EU economy. Those agreements must be respected for them to deliver results. When international trade disputes prove that other countries haven't played by the rules, the EU needs to be able to react efficiently and swiftly to defend its interests", said EU Trade Commissioner Karel de Gucht. > More
