The EU has invested significantly in the UN process leading to the adoption of the Treaty by an overwhelming majority of UN member states on 2 April 2013. The EU has now completed its internal procedures, enabling EU Member States to sign the Treaty on matters covered by EU competence, and firmly believes that the Treaty, when effectively and widely implemented, will contribute towards more responsible and more transparent international arms transfers. > More

"AMBITIOUS" FINAL REPORT OF THE UN HIGH LEVEL PANEL ON POST-2015 DEVELOPMENT AGENDA COMMENDED

Development Commissioner Pielbags commended the report which sets out a universal agenda to eradicate extreme poverty by 2030 and ensures sustainable development of the planet. Building on the lessons learned from the current Millennium Development Goals and taking into account the follow up of the Rio+20 outcome, the Panel made it clear that the post-2015 framework should address the whole range of root causes of poverty and unsustainable development, including equality, equity, human rights, peace and stability. More

EU PARTNERS WITH BILL & MELINDA GATES FOUNDATION TO FIGHT POVERTY-RELATED DISEASES

The two organisations have pledged to work together to fight HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria and other poverty-related diseases that together affect more than 1 billion people worldwide. The partnership will invest in research and development of life-saving interventions to improve the health and well-being of people living in developing countries.

First estimates from Eurostat revealed that the EU27 external current account recorded a surplus of \in 21.8 billion (0.7% of GDP) in the first quarter of 2013, compared with a deficit of 7.7 billion (-0.2% of GDP) in the first quarter of 2012. \triangleright More

The thirteenth edition of Green Week under the banner "Cleaner Air for All" was held from 4-7 June in Brussels and saw 3000 participants gather for three days to discuss air-related issues. In his closing remarks, Janez Potočnik, European Commissioner for Environment, announced he will soon launch a comprehensive air policy package, with a revised and strengthened air policy strategy setting 2020 as the deadline to implement and ensure full compliance with existing air quality legislation.
