

#### **KEYNOTE SPEAKERS**

**Prof. Dr. Jean McNiff** is Professor of Educational Research at York St John University, UK. She is also a Visiting Professor at the University of Tromsø, Norway; Beijing Normal University and Ningxia Teachers' University, People's Republic of China; and the Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University, South Africa. Formerly a Deputy Head Teacher in a mainstream secondary school in the UK, she moved into business for herself and later into Higher Education. She continues to run a successful consultancy and publishing business.

Her institutional work now focuses on working with academic staff internationally, as they undertake their action enquiries for doctoral accreditation and write for publication. Jean's writings have exercised worldwide influence and her textbooks are used extensively on workplace and university courses. Her website at www.jeanmcniff.com is widely acknowledged as a valuable resource for educational researchers.



**Prof. Dr. Christopher Day** is Professor of Education at the University of Nottingham. His particular concerns centre upon teachers' lives and work, successful school leadership, disadvantage, learning networks, and change. During the last twenty years, he has directed a number of large scale, qualitative and mixed methods national, European and international research projects in the education sector. His books have been published in several languages.

Recent funded research projects which he has led include, 'Variations in teachers' work, lives and effectiveness'(2002-2006), Successful leadership and student outcomes in effective and improving schools'(2006-2009), 'Leading schools in disadvantaged urban areas: A seven country European Project' (2003-2005), 'Policy enactment in schools in England and

Hong Kong'(2012-2014), and Leadership for learning in schools in urban disadvantaged settings'(2013-2014). Publications in which he is lead author include: Teachers matter (Open University Press, 2007), Thenew lives of teachers (Routledge, 2010), Schoolleadership and student outcomes: Building and sustaining success (Open University Press, 2011), and Resilient teachers, resilient schools (Routledge, 2014).

In recognition of his work internationally in the field of continuing professional development for teachers, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Linkoping, Sweden, in 1993 and, in 2010, the Michael Huberman Award for excellence in research on teachers by the American Educational Research Association. In 2012 he received the award of Academician of the Academy of Social Sciences.



**Prof. Dr. Bridget Somekh**, BA, PGCE, Adv Dip Ed, MA, PhD is Professor of Educational Research (Emeritus) in the Education and Social Research Institute at Manchester Metropolitan University. She was an Editor of the international journal, *Educational Action Research*, from its foundation in 1993 until 2008, and in 2009 published the Sage Handbook of Educational Action Research, co-edited with Susan Noffke.

In 2011, the second edition of her book on research methods, *Theory and Methods in Social Research*, co-edited with Cathy Lewin, was published by Sage. Until 2008, she was a member of the coordinating group of the Collaborative Action Research

Network, and since 2009 has been active in establishing regional CARN groups in New Zealand and Malaysia.

Her research interest is the process of innovation and the management of change, in particular changes in teaching and learning practices and the impact of ICT on users and their organizations.

Bridget is internationally known for her work in both ICT in Education and Action Research and has been a keynote speaker at many international conferences in Europe, Asia, Austral-Asia, North and South America. During 2009, she was a Visiting Canterbury Fellow at the University of Canterbury, New Zealand, and this was followed by her appointment as an Adjunct Professor at University of Canterbury (2010-2013). During 2009-2011, she was also an Adjunct Professor at Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris (UPSI), Malaysia.
