#### Professor Emeritus Tan Sri Dr Zakri bin Abdul Hamid

Since 2010, Tan Sri Zakri has been Science Adviser to the Prime Minister of Malaysia. His other concurrent roles include: Joint Chairman, Malaysian Industry-Government Group for High Technology (MIGHT); Chairman, Malaysian Biotechnology Corporation (BIOTECHCORP); Chairman, National Professors Council; Chairman, Board of Advisers, UNU-International Institute on Global Health and Pro-Chancellor, Universiti Perguruan Sultan Idris. Tan Sri Zakri co-chaired the UN's mega-study, "Millennium Ecosystem Assessment" from 2001 to 2005. He is the founding Chair of the Intergovernmental Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) and a member of the UN Secretary-General's Scientific Advisory Board. He sits on the Global Leadership Council of the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN). He has been appointed by the United Nations (UN) as the Co-Chairman of STI Advisory Board of the UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP). Tan Sri Zakri is also the recipient of the Academy of Science of South Africa Distinguished Visiting Scholar Award (2015).

#### **Puan Noor Aieda Ahmad**

Puan Noor Aieda Ahmad is the Director of R&D and Business Services Division at Malaysian Investment Development Authority. She manages the promotion and evaluation of projects, talent development as well as the direction of the sectors to be in line with national policies and aspirations.

Matt is currently working as a Commercialisation Specialist at PlaTCOM Ventures.
